Future People Leaders Programme

Who is it for?

Targeted at future people leaders who aspire to become deputy directors in the next 12 to 18 months. To increase representation in the profession, applications from **underrepresented** groups are encouraged.

To be eligible for this programme, you need to

- be a senior people professional working within the NHS,
- able to demonstrate your potential and ambition to move into a deputy director role in the next 12 to 18 months

How much does it cost?

There is a fee of £2000 for each place on the programme which will be paid by the sponsoring organisation.

This is also **match funded** by NHS England.

What to expect?
